The results are in!


A very BIG thank you to everyone who responded to Questionnaire 1 from the Neighbourhood Planning Team.

There are 550 properties altogether in Aldington and Bonnington. We sent 2 questionnaires to each house, as everyone's view counts and we received 210 responses, covering all postcodes within the joint parish. This is great for a first survey, so *thank you* — though we would, of course, be very happy to see a response from *every* house!

The Steering Team are now busy deciphering your responses. It's intriguing to see the similarities and differences of view from the various age groups and segments of the community: those that live in the middle of the village, for example, versus those that reside in the more outlying areas.

One thing that is very clear, being in the countryside is what we all love about living in Aldington and Bonnington; 90% of respondents felt that our Neighbourhood Plan should consider how we protect our countryside, with 75% thinking that it should consider what is built in the village and 71% thinking that our Plan should address community services. What cannot be fitted into a Neighbourhood Plan will be considered by Aldington & Bonnington Parish Council and shape future actions, activities and events. A plan has been drawn up to replace some of the planting and to enhance the area. This has been costed and CIIr Harman has agreed to cover the cost from her Borough Council Ward Member Grant. Aldington Primary School will be assisting with the planting.

Nature, trees, fields and...the pond...

This summer, as many will be aware, the pond water levels were seriously affected by the lack of rain. The pond has a complicated history; being a deliberately created nature pond, it does not have a natural water source, beyond collecting ground water from beneath Reynold's Field, of which there is none during long dry spells.



We have been working with local ecologist Martin
Newcombe and The Kentish
Stour Countryside Project to review the entire Reynold's and Quarry Wood, Quarry Field area, including the pond. Our action plan will start with pond clearance this Autumn and will continue hereafter with a review

of planting and grass cutting

regimes with the aim of enhancing the natural environment that we are lucky to have at the core of Aldington.
